Transitional Housing Programs in Arizona

(Adopted 08/21/2025 – JHFCharity Resource Guide)

1. AHCCCS Housing Program (AHP) – Permanent Supportive Housing

Overview: Subsidized rental units for individuals with Serious Mental Illness (SMI) or General Mental Health/Substance Use (GMHSU) needs. Includes supportive services like eviction prevention, deposits, and case management.

• Eligibility Requirements:

- o Must be 18 or older.
- o Must have SMI designation or GMHSU and be AHCCCS-enrolled.
- o U.S. citizen or eligible immigrant.
- o Income verification and documented housing need.
- o Must report income or household changes annually.
- Cost: Tenant pays up to 30% of monthly income, remainder subsidized.
- Contact: Through your AHCCCS provider or care coordinator.

2. House of Refuge – Mesa, AZ

Overview: Transitional housing for families with children or expecting mothers. Provides case management, education, and employment support.

• Eligibility Requirements:

- o Must have custody of a child under 18 or be pregnant (third trimester).
- o Arizona resident, homeless, at risk of eviction, or fleeing domestic violence.
- o Minimum verifiable income: \$1,170/month (SSI, paycheck, etc.—no cash jobs).
- o Background check required (no sex offenses).
- o Must pass a drug/alcohol test and remain sober.

Cost:

- o \$400/month (utilities included).
- Starting Jan 1, 2025: \$200 deposit + last month's rent (\$400) due at move-in.

3. Thrive AZ – Transitional Housing (Ages 18–24, Foster Youth)

Overview: Semi-supervised housing program for youth 18–24 aging out of foster care. Provides apartments, dorms, and Hope House maternity housing with mentoring and life skills.

• Eligibility Requirements:

- o Must be 18–24 years old.
- o Must have been in or aged out of foster care.
- Must participate in Independent Living (IL) or Youth Assessment Program (YAP).
- o Clean criminal record (no DV or crimes against children).
- o Must be drug-, alcohol-, and tobacco-free; subject to random testing.
- **Program Duration:** 1-year program.

4. Homeward Bound – A New Leaf (Phoenix, AZ)

Overview: Long-term affordable housing campus with 76 two-bedroom units for families leaving homelessness or domestic violence. Includes childcare, financial literacy, and job readiness support.

• Eligibility Requirements:

- o Families with income at or below 50–60% of Area Median Income (AMI).
- o Section 8 and Rapid Re-Housing voucher holders accepted.
- Amenities: Childcare center, playground, fitness area, laundry facilities, gated access.
